### Reconciling Stubborn Medication Lists:

Rec: 22 Jan 2013 You've clicked on that button until your mouse threatens to surrender, but the list refuses to be reconciled. After

logging off Allscripts, logging back on, verifying and adding unverified medications from the pharmacy, the yellow reconciliation glow refuses to be satisfied. Before you give up hope, try this tip to locate the problem:

- From the clinical desktop, right-click within the "Meds"
- 2. Scroll down to the bottom of menu and select "Show Potentially Duplicate Meds."



3. This will reveal a list of unverified duplicate medications. Once these medications are verified or removed, you should be able to reconcile your medication list.

Have you ever spent way too much time searching for something in the works database? I know I have

"Is the patient's email address stored in the person table, or the patient\_member table, or the person\_other table? Maybe it is stored in the patient\_contact table? Is there an email\_address\_of\_patient table? Is there a view I can use? Would Google know?"

Hopefully this query can come in handy for you. I know it has helped me more than a few times. Run the query in the works database and change the '%email%' portion to what you are searching for. Use the %'s for wildcards. Select \* from INFORMATION\_SCHEMA. COLUMNS (nolock) where column\_name like '%email%'.

# **Build Trick**

# Note Building Tip:

When building any forms that you are going to use the ALL NORMAL button, change the font color on the findings included as all normal. This will give the providers a "Visual" of what is going to show as NORMAL before they click the button, rather than having to look at the accumulator or output to see this. They can then easily de-select the items that don't apply, or chose to not use the all normal if it would cause more clicks in that circumstance.
